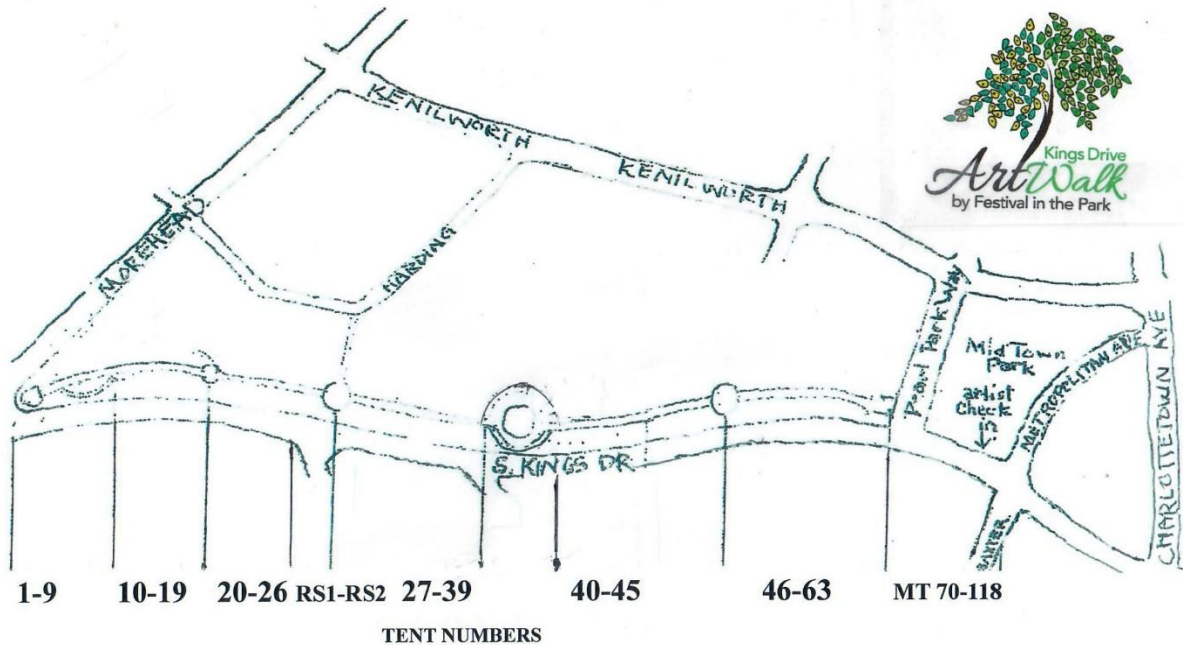
We are delighted to have your participation in our 16th annual Kings Drive Art Walk, located on the beautiful Sugar Creek Greenway.

Check-In/Registration Procedures/Unloading

- Check-in time: Saturday, May 2, 6:30 am - 9:00am – the show opens at 11:00 am
- Early check-in time: Friday, May 1, 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm at Midtown Park for tent setup. There is no security for early check-in . Unloading on S. Kings Drive will **NOT** be available, as it will be during rush hour. You will park and dolly to your location for early check-in. (Early set up waiver required, included in packet, please bring)
- Registration is at Midtown Park on S. Kings Drive near Baxter Street/Metropolitan Avenue. You will receive your space assignment, exhibitor badges, and parking location. You may park on South Kings Drive only while registering for check-in.
- As a reminder, 24-hour security will be on-site, but security cannot always be everywhere. Please be able to secure your booth.
- Unload on South Kings Drive. Tent numbers will be posted on the phone poles to help you locate the area of your tent.
- Vehicles must be removed from S. Kings Drive as soon as they are unloaded. All vehicles must be **OFF of Kings Drive by 10:00 am on Saturday.**
- Then, proceed to the exhibitor parking area.
- A hospitality area will be available at the check-in area. You are welcome to enjoy some refreshments.



Follow the arrows to the Loading Zone on Kings Drive. Here, you can **UNLOAD** supplies from your vehicle. Immediately after unloading, **PARK** the vehicle at the designated parking area. Then, return to **SETUP**. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Vehicle Rules

All vehicles must drive to the location along Kings Drive, immediately **UNLOAD, PARK** vehicle at the designated Exhibitor Parking Area, then **SETUP**.

- No parking or driving is allowed in grassy areas.
- All vehicles must be removed from Kings Drive as soon as they are unloaded.
- Vehicles may not remain parked on Kings Drive during Festival hours.
- You must have a parking pass for the vendor parking lot. It is attached below.
- Upon closing on Sunday, vehicles can park on Kings Drive after 5:00 pm. Vendors must be packed before parking on Kings Drive to load up. This is for your safety and the safety of our patrons.
- If parking in the surrounding neighborhoods, **BE CONSIDERATE** of the homeowners; watch for the "No Parking" signs!
- Out of consideration of nearby retail stores, please do not park in their parking lots.

Parking is available all day on Saturday and Sunday at/on:

- Satellite parking for Kings Drive Art Walk vendors is on Edgehill Road N. via shuttle. You will need a parking pass.
- South Torrence
- Baldwin Avenue
- Ellison Street
- Henley Place

Note: Be respectful of our neighbors: avoid blocking their driveways and intruding on their property. The police will issue citations and/or tow vehicles for illegal parking.

Fire Marshall

The Fire Marshall requires that each tent be secured at each corner with a **minimum of 40-pound weights**. Applicants shall ensure that tents are adequately roped, braced, anchored, and secured to ensure stability in light of weather conditions. Tents must also include a certificate certifying that tents are fire retardant or must have sewn-in labels indicating the same. Applicants shall be responsible for all damage caused by any tent, including personal injury or death, or property damage, whether from a tent that collapses, blows away, or is otherwise not secure or unsafe. Stakes are not allowed.



- If you requested and paid for it, one 110 electrical outlet is allowed per tent, with a maximum of 400 watts will be provided.
- No overnight lodging is allowed on or adjacent to Sugar Creek Greenway.
- Any damage by the vendor to Sugar Creek Greenway will be at the vendor's expense. Forty-pound weights or more are required for securing tents on each leg.

Our main "Information Tent" is located along the Greenway across from Melting Pot Restaurant. HAVE A QUESTION??? Contact text or call the **Volunteer/Artists Relations Committee (ARC)** at **704-200-5612**. We will get to you as soon as possible. Please understand we work by order, and your situation will be handled in the order received.

Booth Sitting

Take a break. If you are the only person staffing your booth, Kings Drive Art Walk will provide a volunteer to relieve you for a half-hour. **Sign up for the entire Festival Friday afternoon at check-in or Saturday morning.**

- Booth sitters will not be responsible for selling goods or exchanging funds for items sold by the artists.
- At the beginning of the KDAW, artists can sign up for booth sitting. The ARC will be responsible for having a booth sitter available to tend to the artist's booth for no more than 30 minutes at a time per booth. The service will be provided no more than four times per artist/booth daily.
- Booth sitting will not be available for artists with two or more adults attending the Festival. Both the volunteers will do booth sitting for the Festival and the ARC members based on the availability of the volunteers and ARC members.

Inclement Weather Closing

Kings Drive Art Walk is a rain-or-shine event. In case of inclement weather, **you may choose** to close your booth and remove your artwork from the elements. You must **notify festival staff before closing your booth**. Parking on S. Kings Drive during KDAW operating hours is prohibited.

Vendor Move Out

- Tom Geisler, Kings Drive Art Walk security coordinator, requires you to pack up everything before you move your vehicle to the road for loading on Sunday at 5 pm. You will not be allowed to stop on the road until the end of the KDAW while police cars are blocking the lane.

In no event shall the Kings Drive Art Walk have any liability or obligation for damage to property or injury to persons caused by using the Kings Drive Art Walk premises before the Official Setup Time. By signing where indicated below, the undersigned hereby irrevocably and unconditionally releases and fully discharges Kings Drive Art Walk and its affiliates, officers, directors, employees, and agents from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, and damages arising from or sustained by the undersigned in connection with the early setup of the undersigned's booth and materials before the Official Setup Time. The undersigned shall indemnify and save harmless the Kings Drive Art Walk and its affiliates, officers, directors, employees, and agents from and against all losses, damages, expenses, and liabilities arising directly or indirectly from the use of the Kings Drive Art Walk premises before the Official Setup Time.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Awarded spaces are non-transferable. No one will be allowed to exhibit without first having juried into the Event and having paid the exhibition fee to the Event. Shared spaces are not permitted, and each exhibitor must jury separately. Displays must fit into designated spaces without infringing upon neighboring spaces.
- The opportunity to meet the artists and discuss their work in an informal setting attracts many visitors and increases sales. Artists should demonstrate their craft sometime during Event hours for the benefit of those who attend unless prior approval has been secured in writing from the Director.
- Exhibitors must participate for the entire two days of the Event. A signed application is a commitment to show. *No refunds will be made 30 days before the Event.*
- Each exhibitor must realize this is an outdoor show; there is no level ground as in mall shows, and the weather can be uncooperative. There will be no refunds due to inclement weather.
- The Event insists that all exhibits maintain good taste. The Director of the Event shall have the sole discretion to require the removal of any work that he or she determines violates the Event's rules. Exhibitors shall not display or offer any adulterated, misbranded, or impure articles for sale.
- Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining and leaving their assigned areas free of refuse and otherwise in good condition. Park litter laws prohibit distributing promotional material unless approval is obtained in writing from the Director of the Event.
- Only the Event can sell t-shirts, sweatshirts, balloons, and caps bearing the Event logo. Any other similar item sold/given away by any other organization during the Event may be confiscated.
- Although the Festival in the Park is a Charitable Organization [Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c) (3)], the exhibit fees for the Event are not charitable deductions. However, exhibit fees may qualify as tax-deductible business expenses. Please consult your tax advisor.
- Each exhibitor is responsible for collecting North Carolina and County of Mecklenburg sales tax (8.25%) and paying it to the NC Department of Revenue.

Web link: <https://www.ncdor.gov/taxes-forms/sales-and-use-tax> . Festival in the Park is not acting as an agent and will not be responsible for collecting or paying any sales tax. There is no commission charge for any art sales.
- The Event will not be responsible in any way for any theft or damage to the exhibit or equipment or any other property belonging to Vendor or Vendor's employees who are participating in the Event nor (ii) for any theft or other loss of vendor's proceeds or receipts from his/her/its participation in the Event. Since there is no way to insure the property of individuals attending or participating in the Event, either as an exhibitor, an artist displaying artwork or photography on a panel board, or a person or group of persons performing on the stage, each individual must be entirely responsible for their equipment, artwork, crafts, or the like, proceeds, receipts, or



any other property of any kind whatsoever, and should plan accordingly, to prevent any theft or mysterious disappearance of any of same during the Event.

- Registration will begin on Saturday (the first Event day) from 6:30 am to 9:00 am. **No one will be allowed to check in after 9:00 am.** (Early check-in for artists is offered on Friday afternoon from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm at Midtown Park. You may set up your tent, but no merchandise. No vehicles are allowed on the Greenway.
- Upon the announcement from security on Sunday closing, vehicles will be allowed to park on S. Kings Dr. This is for your safety and the safety of your patrons.
- Failure to abide by the rules and regulations herein may be grounds for removal from the Event. No refunds will be provided for such removal.
- Each exhibitor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Event for any damage, cost, or liability caused by an act or omission of the exhibitor during or related to the Event.

Kings Drive Art Walk Will Provide

- Tent location assignments (all locations are assigned at the Event's discretion).
- One 110 electrical outlet per tent. (The additional fee for electricity is \$60.) Each outlet will pull a maximum of four (4) 100-watt spots. **NO MORE** than four (4) 100-watt spots are allowed. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Vendors will be required to lower wattage if not in compliance.
- All booth locations are easily accessible for setup/tear down.
- Exhibitor parking - 24-hour security.

Kings Drive Art Walk Will NOT Provide

- Tent
- Display equipment for setup of exhibit tents.
- Tables or chairs.
- Electrical equipment (including drop cords, light bulbs, fixtures, etc.)

Reminders

- Exhibit spaces are awarded based on the quality and variety of the exhibitor pool.
- All work on exhibit must be original and attributable solely to the demonstrating craftsperson or display artist.
- Festival in the Park takes no commission for any art sales.
- The Festival Exhibitor Committee will screen each artist/exhibitor during the KDAW. If the work exhibited violates the rules and regulations or the slides or photographs submitted, the artist/exhibitors must leave the KDAW. The Committee's judgment will be final, and no refunds will be given.
- Festival in the Park's mission is to unite the community through the arts. As such, the Festival values and celebrates diversity and requires that all artists, vendors, concessionaires, and others whose applications are accepted to make sales or otherwise



participate at Festival in the Park and/or King's Drive Art Walk respect all attendees, volunteers, staff, and other participants in line with the Festival's commitment to diversity. **The Festival reserves the right to address any failure to do so at any time, as it deems appropriate, including expulsion from King's Drive Art Walk, without a refund.**

Advertising Before and During KDAW 2026

Kings Drive Art Walk's (KDAW) pre-event communications strategy employs a combination of signage in high-profile locations, paid media, earned media, e-mail marketing, and social media outreach to target the Charlotte metro media market.

We receive extensive publicity and coverage for the KDAW over the Charlotte metro media market through our media relationships with digital media publishers and nearly all our region's radio and television broadcasters. KDAW is often featured on WCCB Charlotte, WBTV News, Charlotte Today (WCNC, NBC Charlotte), NBC Charlotte News (WCNC, NBC Charlotte), Charlotte Five, Queen City Weekend (WSOC, ABC), and Axios Charlotte.

Radio outlets covering the Charlotte metro market have also mentioned KDAW on-air and online, including drive-time radio programs across all formats (Country, Urban, Rock, Talk, etc.). We are also included in neighborhood/community newsletters across Charlotte.

Our paid media outreach includes WFAE (National Public Radio - 90.7 FM) and boosted social media posts on Facebook.

The KDAW has been included in dozens of online event calendars throughout the region, often as the top-billed Event for the weekend of the Festival.

Our e-mail marketing targets more than 7,500+ households in four messages sent in October.

Signage in Charlotte's city center includes Overstreet banners. The banners are posted for one month before the KDAW in the heavily trafficked Tryon Street corridor, resulting in more than 5 million impressions.

Our social media channels include Facebook (over 16,000+) and Instagram 12,000, where we employ a variety of tactics to engage a broad and diverse audience, including paid/boosted posts.

Through this communications strategy, our outreach will obtain millions of impressions from the audience throughout October across the Charlotte metro region to continue attracting robust patronage for the KDAW.

Tent Guidelines and Permitting Requirements

The guidelines established herein are based on provisions of the North Carolina Fire Code. Any proposed alternative measures to the requirements below shall provide an equal level of safety and shall require prior approval of the fire official. Tent and membrane structures must comply with all North Carolina Fire Code sections.

Permits:

The erection of any tent or canopy above 800 square feet requires prior approval and an operational permit issued by the Charlotte Fire Department, Fire Prevention Bureau Office. Exceptions:

- Tents or canopies not exceeding 1,800 square feet that are open on all sides without sidewalls, drops, or other physical obstructions on 75 percent or more of the perimeter.
- Tents or canopies used exclusively for camping or funeral services.

Before a permit is granted, a certificate must be submitted to the fire official certifying the tent is composed of materials meeting the flame propagation performance criteria of Test Method 1 or Test Method 2 of NFPA 701.

Additionally, any tent with an occupant load of 50 or more persons shall require the submittal of a detailed site plan indicating seating and table arrangements, location of any stage and other interior structures, exit arrangements, and location and type of heating and electrical equipment.

Access, Location and Parking:

Fire apparatus access roads shall be a minimum of 20 feet, and roads shall not be obstructed in any manner, including the parking of vehicles.

Tents shall not be located within 20 feet of lot lines, buildings, other tents or membrane structures, and internal combustion engines, with the following exceptions:

- Separation distances between tents and membrane structures NOT used for cooking are not required when the aggregate floor area of the tents does not exceed 15,000 square feet.
- Tents need not be separated from buildings when ALL of the following conditions are met:
 1. The aggregate floor area of the tent or membrane structure shall not exceed 10,000 square feet.
 2. The aggregate area of the tent AND building shall not exceed the allowable floor area as indicated in the International Building Code.
 3. Required exiting is maintained for the tent and building, including travel distances.
 4. Fire apparatus access roads are maintained.

Tents with an area of 15,000 square feet or more shall not be located closer than 50 feet from any building or other tent, except with connecting corridors between multiple tents.



Connecting corridors are allowed, provided that an approved exit is located at each end of such corridor.

A fire break or access of not less than 12 feet shall be maintained on all sides of tents unless otherwise approved by the fire official.

Tents shall be adequately roped, braced, and anchored to withstand the elements of weather and to guard against collapse.

Means of Egress:

Means of egress from tents shall comply with the following:

- Exits shall be spaced at equal intervals as can be best accomplished.
- Any area of the tent shall be located within 100 feet of an exit.
- The required number and minimum width of exits shall be in accordance with the following:
 1. Occupant load (OL) 10 to 199: Minimum 2 exits, minimum 72 inches per exit.
 2. OL 200 to 499: Minimum 3 exits, 72 inches per exit.
 3. OL 500 to 999: Minimum 4 exits, 96 inches per exit.
 4. OL 1,000 to 1,999: Minimum 5 exits, 120 inches per exit; or 7 exits, 96 inches per exit.
 5. OL 2,000 to 2,999: Minimum 6 exits, 120 inches per exit; or 8 exits, 96 inches per exit.
 6. Over 3,000: Minimum 7 exits, 120 inches per exit; or 9 exits, 96 inches per exit. Note: For occupant loads exceeding 3,000, minimum exits shall be based on the total occupant load multiplied by 0.2 inches per person.
- Curtains over exit openings shall be of a color or colors that contrast the adjoining tent color, and curtains shall be on sliding metal supports located a minimum of 80 inches above the floor surface. Curtains may be taped along edges with colored tape to achieve the contrast requirements stated above if approved by the fire official.
- Exit doors, if required, shall open in the direction of travel.
- Proper aisle widths shall be maintained for theater-style seating. Consult with your fire inspector for further.
- Seats in theater-style seating arrangements with more than 200 chairs must be fastened together in groups of not less than three to create seat stability.
- Exit signs shall be clearly posted at each exit for tents serving an OL of 50 persons or more. Exit signs shall be either listed and labeled in accordance with UL 924 as the "internally illuminated" type, or externally illuminated in accordance with the following:
 1. For OL of 300 or less, two separate circuits, one of which is separate from all other circuits. Or
 2. For OL of more than 300, two sources of power, one of which is an "emergency system" supplied by batteries or on-site generators, for a minimum of 90 minutes duration.
- Means of egress shall be illuminated at floor level during all times the tent is occupied. In most cases, the general lighting already available will satisfy this requirement.

Fire Protection Equipment:

Portable dry chemical fire extinguishers with a minimum 2A-10BC rating shall be provided so that travel distance does not exceed 75 from any point to an extinguisher.

Extinguishers shall have updated inspection tags (inspected annually) and shall be mounted on approved hangers. The hanging of extinguishers utilizing zip ties etc. is not acceptable.



Certain use conditions (fireworks sales, etc.) may require pressurized water extinguishers in addition to the dry chemical type.

Cooking Tents:

All cooking tents shall be provided with a Class K fire extinguisher.

Heating or warming of food utilizing solid fuel burning materials (i.e., Sterno fuel cans) shall be approved, provided such use is not within 10 feet of an exit or combustible materials.

Cooking tents shall be separated from all other tents by a minimum of 20 feet.

Heating of Tents:

Heating of tents shall be accomplished by forced air, with the heating equipment located outside. LP gas containers for heating shall be located as follows:

- Containers with a capacity of 500 gallons or less shall be located a minimum of 10 feet from tent.
- Containers with a capacity of greater than 500 gallons shall be located a minimum of 25 feet from tent.
- All hoses for LP tanks shall be protected from physical damage, and LP gas tank valves shall be fully accessible and closed when not in use.

General:

Generators and other internal combustion power sources shall be located a minimum of 20 feet from tents and protected from public contact by fencing, barricades, etc.

Combustible decorative material is strictly prohibited and floor service and area surrounding the exterior of the tent up to 30 feet shall be free of combustible material that may present a fire hazard.

Crowd managers shall be required at a ratio of 1 per 250 occupants.

CFD stand-by personnel will be required for tents with an occupant load of 300 persons or more.
